60 Semester Hours

The Associate in Arts degree program is designed for students who expect to complete a degree at a four-year institution in such disciplines as art, education, English, history, journalism, library, pre-law, psychology, sociology, or speech. The curriculum gives students a broad educational background in liberal arts with an emphasis on humanities and social science. Students should consult the catalog of the institution to which they expect to transfer and should select appropriate courses in consultation with their advisor.
