BACKGROUND: In accordance with state code, the Board "shall elect one

of its appointed lay members to be chairperson in June of each year. No member may serve as chairperson for more

than two consecutive years."

The current Chair, Faron Shanholtz, and Vice Chair, Robert Tissue, were elected in June 2010 for the first time and re-elected to serve a second term in June 2011. Consequently, under current statutes Chairman Shanholtz is not eligible to serve again as chair in FY 2013 nor Vice-Chairman Tissue as Vice-Chair in 2013.
