Moorefield – Sept. 18, 2013 - Open Auditions for a theatrical presentation about Appalachian resiliency are scheduled for Wednesday, October 15 at 5:00 pm in the Resource Center of Eastern WV Community and Technical College's Moorefield campus. Focusing on Appalachian resiliency, 'Revelations: A Stage Reading Celebration Appalachian Resiliency in Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender People' demonstrates that Appalachians are a diverse group of people, including a wide range of ethnic, religious and sexual minorities, as well as strong and active women.

Written and produced by folklorist Carrie Nobel Kline, 'Revelations' interweaves the oral testimonies of 12 West Virginians and one non-Appalachian who "engage the audience with a fresh perspective on concepts of gender from people who have broadened their own views through complex intellectual and spiritual journeys," Kline said.

Folklorist Kline received a Rockefeller Fellowship in the spring of 2001 as a Scholar-in-Residence at the Center for the Study of Ethnicity and Gender in Appalachia, at Marshall University in Huntington, West Virginia. The Center sponsors research on Appalachian communities, history and individuals to battle narrow stereotypes of Appalachian people.
