In the summer of 2017, there was a big push on new platforms and, in fall 2017, Google was added. Transitioned from stock photography to actual Eastern students and faculty. Consistent branding was established. In the spring of 2018, local radio and newspapers were added. An enrollment landing page was created, as was a workforce landing page, and a landing page for high school juniors and seniors. Carousel images on the website were

updated, as was every program brochure. In the summer/fall of 2018, the catalog was redesigned. Underway now are updates to the website, rural economic development brochure, and a ramp-up with AP220. D. Bean indicated that the Moorefield Examiner and Hampshire Review were not included in the list of newspapers that Eastern advertises in. C. Balfany indicated that other newspapers tend to give advertising discounts. R. Tissue asked about the value proposition (affordability). C.
