EWVCTC Courses for juniors and seniors.

ENL 101 English Composition **Tuition \$120.00*** 3 semester hours
Prerequisite: Minimum acceptable test scores for placement in college-level English.
An introduction to basic composition. The major thrust is directed toward achieving competency in writing a composition. ENL 101 introduces students to the practice of writing with emphasis on the writing process, thesis development, context, purpose, and audience.

HIT 240 American History I – 1492-1877 **Tuition \$120.00*** 3 semester hours
An interpretive study of the cultural, diplomatic, political, environmental, and social history of the colonial, federal, and Civil War eras. Emphasis will be placed on significant ideas and personalities.

PSY 200 General Psychology **Tuition \$120.00*** 3 Semester Hours
Introduces the principles and methods of the scientific study of human behavior.

AHS 108 Medical Terminology **Tuition \$120.00**+\$25 online fee*+\$10 Allied Health fee
3 Semester Hours

Medical Terminology is a 16-week course designed to provide the student with basic knowledge of medical language. The approach to understanding medical language will be one of systems approach. Prefixes, suffixes, words roots, combining forms, special ending, plural forms, abbreviation, and symbols will be utilized. Emphasis is placed on spelling, definition, usage, and pronunciation.

***Tuition Rates subject to change. If course is offered online, there will be a \$25 online fee added to the tuition.**

IS EARLY ENTRANCE COLLEGE-CREDIT TRANSFERABLE?

All college-level courses earned are transferable to other West Virginia colleges and universities and to most other institutions of higher education throughout the nation. Occasionally, an out-of-state university will not accept Early Entrance credits; if you know where you will be attending, we suggest that you check with the appropriate college official now to determine transferability.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- The high school principal or counselor must approve the registration of students.
- Parents/guardians must complete the Course Authorization & Responsibility Form
- The College must approve the student for admission of the course(s).
- Course prerequisites must be met. (for English, Math, Biology, & some business classes)
 - Score requirements are listed in the College Catalog.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO TAKE A CLASS?

(Subject to Revision)

Tuition for college classes taught to early entrance students will be \$40.00 per credit hour which means it will be \$120.00 per 3-credit course. There is a **\$25.00 fee for each online (Web) class** plus a \$15.00 lab fee for Biology/Chemistry/General Science. Medical Terminology has a \$10.00 Allied Health Fee

WHEN IS TUITION DUE?

Tuition is due by the first day of class. For the Fall semester, deadline for payment is August 17, 2020, or the **FIRST** day of your high school classes whichever comes first. **Starting Fall 2020, students must login to myEastern (student account) to view tuition charges. Bills will NOT be sent.**

The Early Entrance add/drop period is within the FIRST week of your high school's first day of attendance. If you want to withdraw from a college class, you must notify your high school counselor and the college for correct withdraw procedure.

Eastern WV CTC Accreditation Information

In October 2008, Eastern WV Community and Technical College received formal accreditation from the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools (NCA) as an independent, freestanding community and technical college. Following a HLC team visit to Eastern, HLC reaffirmed the accreditation in February 2014 and April 2018.

MyEastern (Student Account)

All Eastern students can access the MyEastern website for several self-service purposes. Currently, the services available to high school students are *check grades, view unofficial transcripts and Pay Tuition & Fees Online*.

To Pay Tuition and Fees:

1. Go to the [MyEastern website \(https://rand.wvnet.edu:9797\)](https://rand.wvnet.edu:9797)
2. Click on 'Enter Secure Area.'
3. Type in your User ID/Eastern Student ID Number.
4. Type in your PIN (your birthday in six digits– for example, October 10, 1970 would be 101070).
5. Click on 'Student Records.' (*view your grades in this area!*)
6. Click on 'Account Summary by Term' (your *Tuition and Fees* will display).
7. Click 'Pay Tuition and Fees' at the bottom of the screen.
8. Select the Term for which you are paying *Tuition and Fees* from the drop down box and click 'Submit.'
9. Enter the Amount you are paying and click 'Submit' (you should pay the total due for the semester unless you have made other arrangements with the business office).
10. Click the Credit Card graphic to pay by credit card or the Check graphic to pay by check.
11. Enter the required information and click 'Pay.' (*Do not click 'Pay' more than once or your payment may be doubled.*)
12. After the payment has been processed you should receive a 'success' or 'failure' message. After this you may logout or continue with other tasks on the site.
